Key Vocab

Artefact— an object made by a human that has cultural or religious importance.

Archaeology— the study of human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains.

Archaeologist—a person who studies human history and prehistory through artefacts and remains.

Nomadic— living the life of a nomad; wandering.

Pre-historic—A time before written records.

Savage— A life that is often fierce, violent, and uncontrolled.

- 1) Paleolithic—Earliest part
- 2) Mesolithic—Middle part
- 3) Neolithic— Most recent part
