82% of children found out about a new job during the activities



71% of pupils scored the activity as 8 or higher out of 10



78% of pupils felt they learnt a lot about different jobs



59% of pupils now know what they want to do when they grow up



79% now know there are lots of jobs available to them



79% now know that girls and boys can do the same job



71% now understand that men and woman can be equally successful



33% have changed their mind about who they want to become when they grow up



80% know that doing well at school can help them in the future



62% felt the volunteers were similar to them and they could relate to them



77% now know that people like them can be successful when they grow up



73% now feel they can become anyone when they grow up



72% feel more confident in what they can do after the activity



76% Learnt in the activity to listen to others



79% can now explain why it is important to try their best if they're going to get better



Learnt in the activity to speak clearly and explain ideas to a group of people



60% of pupils would like to learn about more jobs and meet more speakers

 After the activity 80% of pupils now understand how Maths/English/Science can be useful in many jobs and the link between learning and the wider world.
