What is the school doing well with remote learning?

We received overwhelmingly positive comments. The following themes were repeated by parents:

- good communication
- live lessons really helped to focus children and helped parents
- organised and consistent
- set timetable and work being set the night before helped with organisation

- high levels of contact and feedback
- the range of lessons (not just English and Maths)
- Much improved compared to the last lockdown
- The support provided from the school has been good

How can the school improve our approach to remote learning

We received some suggestions which we can certainly look at in order to improve our approach to remote learning. These included:

- More live lessons
- Some live lessons were too long
- Have interaction sessions with friends / some sessions to focus on mental health e.g. a team's quiz
- Sometimes instructions were a bit vague
- 1:1 sessions with children / small group sessions
- Not having cameras turned off and microphones muted during live lessons
